You might ask: How did this happen?

As you know, after 7 years with a reduced levy the need for restoring a higher levy is both evident and predicable.

A timeline of events can be easily observed, some very costly, dating back many years

How did this happen

The outline of critical events include:

Increasing high levies: 2012 - 2018: Average \$735,000 (total \$5,150,000)

Followed by reduced levies 2018 – 2025 Exactly \$400,000 (total \$2,800,000)

Below market returns of bank balances 2010 - 2017

Increasing salaries (Town Board Decisions), high legal expenses, special meeting expenses, zoning cost increases

S.I. Bridge, Bridge cover, Palon Road, Harmony Paving (no competive bids), Sturgeon Island Road, Warbler, High water issues, rusted out culverts.

Ditches, signs analysis, engineering costs, anti-dust applications,

Officials' salaries, legal costs, zoning costs, storms, meeting costs, etc, etc, etc)
